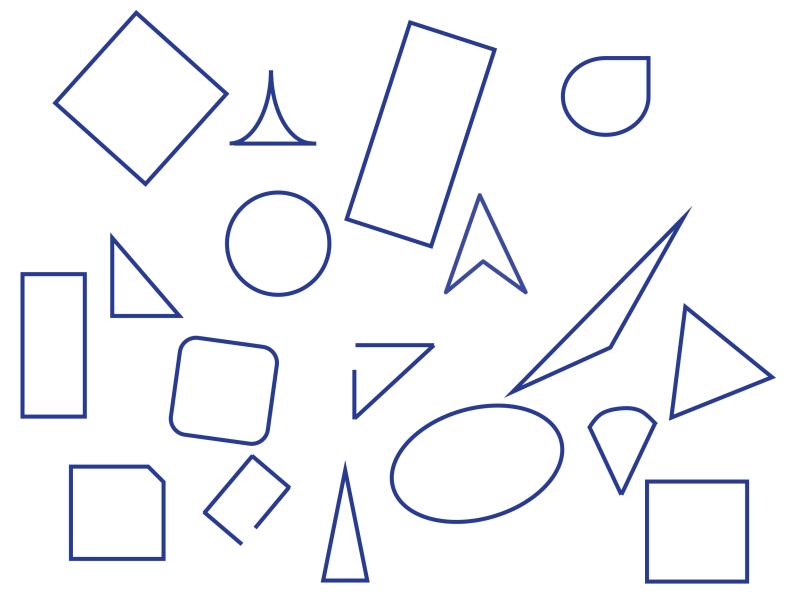
The following sample layouts include examples of shapes that would be safe to jump on and non-examples of shapes that look similar but would not be safe to jump on. You can use the same layouts with all versions of the activity. Change the difficulty of the rules for what shape to jump on as children become more familiar with the shapes and their parts and properties.

General Guidelines for Creating Your Shape Layout

- When creating shapes for play ahead of time, include at least 10 examples of shapes that are safe to jump on, with at least one example shape per child if you have more than 10 children playing at one time.
- These are only ideas to get you started. Feel free to include other shapes, too! Find even more ideas in the Shape Glossary.
